In individual events, Triplett won the boys 11-12 25-meter freestyle with a time of 15.42, while teammate Grady Hughes was the champion of the 8 and under breaststroke event with a winning time of 25.71 as well as the butterfly event (22.93). Triplett also won the backstroke event (18.39).

Kerbs was the champion in the boys 13-14 50-meter freestyle event with a time of 28.08, while teammate Spees won the 50-meter butterfly event

with a time of 30.13, the 100-meter Individual Medley (1:13.58) and the 50-meter backstroke (34.54). Hertenstein was the winner of the boys 13-14 breaststroke event (40.03).


